

DUAL AND JOINT ENROLLMENT COURSE APPROVAL FORM FOR COURSES NOT ELIGIBLE FOR DUAL ENROLLMENT FUNDING

This form is to be used by Georgia high school and home study students who are seeking to:

- enroll in a college/university course(s) for dual enrollment credit (high school and postsecondary credit) or joint enrollment credit (postsecondary credit only); and,
- plan to take a course (or courses) which will be ineligible for State of Georgia Dual Enrollment funding.

Sections A-D are required. **Section E** must be completed by the high school or home study if dual enrollment credit is sought. A completed form is required for postsecondary advisement and course registration. This approval form does not provide approval for State of Georgia Dual Enrollment or HOPE Grant funding.

College/university courses may be more rigorous and challenging, and require a higher degree of independent responsibility and accountability, than high school courses.

The student must apply for dual enrollment admission and be accepted to the college/university.

All attempted college/university courses and grades become a part of the postsecondary academic history and transcripts. Dual enrollment courses and grades also become a part of the high school record.

Tuition, fees, and books are charged in accordance with the college/university policies.

The high school counselor must grant approval before any schedule changes are made unless no high school credit is being sought.

Course withdrawals are recorded on the high school transcript according to the school or school system's dual enrollment withdrawal policy. Withdrawals also appear on the college/university transcript.

Option B/High School Postsecondary Graduation Opportunity Program students must complete all state-required courses and assessments per GADOE assessment guidelines/requirements.
