

Repeat Coursework

The Financial Aid Office has implemented a new federal mandate regarding Repeated Coursework. In accordance with the new July 1, 2011 regulation outlined in Section 668.2, 34 CFR, the definition of a “Full-Time” enrollment has been changed. Institutions are now required to track all repeated courses taken by students receiving Title IV aid. Repeated courses now count toward a student’s enrollment status thus possibly changing eligibility for federal aid based on enrollment criteria.

An institution can pay a student for only one retake of any previously passed course or its equivalency.

Example 1:

| Fall 2018 | English 1101 | Pass | Eligible (1 st repeat*) |
| Spring 2019 | English 1101 | | Not Eligible (2 nd repeat*) |

*Of a previously passed course

Example 2:

| | | | |
|-------------|-----------|------|----------|
| Spring 2018 | Math 1111 | Fail | Eligible |
| Summer 2018 | Math 1111 | Fail | Eligible |
| Fall 2018 | Math 1111 | Fail | Eligible |
| Spring 2019 | Math 1111 | | Eligible |

As a result of any repeated coursework, a student may be enrolled full-time based on institutional policy but can be $\frac{3}{4}$ time or less based on this new regulation regarding repeated coursework.
